Most everyone in Pinckney Retreat is familiar with the Cherry Hill Oak property adjacent to PR and the battle that Hope Cunningham led to ensure that the tree was preserved. The property was purchased with funds from the Rural and Critical Land Fund and will eventually become one of Beaufort County's Passive Parks. But did you know that The Beaufort County **Passive Parks Department** manages and operates over 14,000 acres of property, including pocket parks, nature preserves, historic sites, an interpretive center and event facilities. And they are growing every year!

What is a Passive Park you ask? Passive parks are intended to conserve natural and/or cultural resources, as well as provide open space and/or passive recreation to the residents and visitors of Beaufort County. The development of nature-based activities on passive park properties may include hiking, fishing, camping, hunting, boating, gardening, bicycling, nature studies, and visiting historic sites.

With the recent addition of a Naturalist, the department is able to offer many programs throughout the year. Program offerings include types such as trail talks, fish clinics, birding hikes, saltmarsh meanderings, herpetology clinics, and pollinator talks and are offered on the County passive park properties, in school classrooms and for private communities.
